Exhibitor Entry Information

PENNING:

- Ensure the number of pens your animals will require has been calculated on your entry form—no need to include storage pens as these will be factored in free on the final plan once entries have been received.
- Penning maps will be emailed to all exhibitors prior to the Show.
- All pens are 4.4 m long x 2.5 m wide with gaps between the rails of 200 mm. Concrete floor.
- Unless noted on the entry form—all animal pens will be supplied with barley straw. No other loose bedding permitted.
- Readylawn turf available \$75.00 full pen, \$37.50 half pen. Advise order on entry form
- Power requirements should be noted on the entry form.
- Exhibitors are welcome to display signage and decorate their pens—no 'For Sale' signs—any sales contracts to be finalised off the showgrounds.

Judge's Profile

Natasha Clark, together with her parents Robert and Ann, has been breeding alpacas since 1991 on their stud farm Kurrawa Alpacas in Bellbrae, Victoria. With over 450 alpacas, both suri and huacaya of all colours, Natasha has developed Kurrawa into one of the most successful suri studs in Australia winning Supreme Champion at National and Royal level. A qualified AAA judge in 2000, she has continued to develop her skills to become a senior AAA judge. In 2004 Natasha successfully qualified as an International Judge at the IAJS School in Peru. She has judged in New Zealand and throughout Australia and in 2008 had the privilege of judging the AAA National Alpaca Show.
