PENNING:

- Ensure the number of pens your animals will require has been calculated on your entry form—no need to include storage pens as these will be factored in free on the final plan once entries have been received.
- Penning maps will be emailed to all exhibitors prior to the Show.
- All pens are 4.4 m long x 2.5 m wide with gaps between the rails of 200 mm. Concrete floor.
- Unless noted on the entry form—all animal pens will be supplied with barley straw. No other loose bedding permitted.

- Readylawn turf available \$75.00 full pen, \$37.50 half pen. Advise order on entry form
- Power requirements should be noted on the entry form.
- Exhibitors are welcome to display signage and decorate their pens — no 'For Sale' signs — any sales contracts to be finalised off the showgrounds.
- Sash for best alpaca pen — judged on content, display and tidiness (hint: cattle exhibitors take a broom to sweep the fronts of their pens)

DYNASTY TEAM:

Lineage team to contain 5-8 exhibits—1 grandparent, two direct offspring, remainder to be issue of aforementioned. Exhibits over 6 years do not have to be entered in the breed classes.

Judges Profile—Val Fullerlove—Hanley Castle Alpacas—UK



Val and Michael Fullerlove bought their first alpacas in 1993, and have since built up one of the UK's elite herds - Hanley Hall Alpacas including both the suri and huacaya breeds.

Val is a well known figure within the International Alpaca Community. One of the founders of The British Alpaca Society in 1996, Val served as a board member throughout the Society's early years. She has travelled widely through the Peruvian altiplano, sometimes on buying and selection trips, but also attending the four week course of the International Alpaca Judging School run jointly by Canadian judge Maggie Krieger, and the "father" of international alpaca judging Dr Julio Sumar. Val is best known as a BAS judge and Europe's first and only IAJS International Judge. Val also completed the US five day AOBA training clinic in Colorado under the tutelage of Dr Murray Fowler for anatomy and conformation and Cameron Holt for fleece.

As Britain's senior and most experienced judge, Val has over the last few years judged at the BAS National Show at Newark, the South of England Shows, the Kenilworth Show, the North Devon Shows, the Royal Norfolk, the Devon County, the German National and the French and Swiss Nationals. To complete her IAJS apprenticeship Val also co-judged the four day long 2004 IAJS Show in California and then again as a full judge in 2006. Val is also a BAS judge Tutor. She has been involved in the screening of the German herd onto the new European Register and also regularly screens animals for BAS whilst they await import into the UK. Val is scheduled to judge eight shows in 2011 including the International Show in California with Peter Kennedy and Julio Sumar, the UK National Fleece Show and Bath & West Show.
